Clare Freund, Pharm.D., BCPS – Primary Care

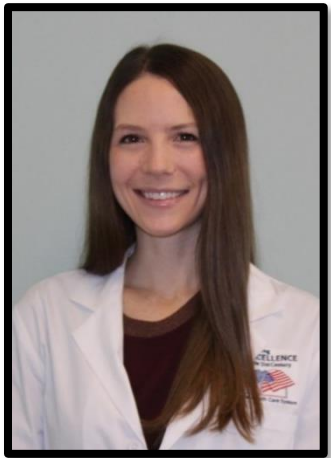
